**FIRST LESSON**

**Isaiah 61:1-6**

The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion-- to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor. They will rebuild the ancient ruins and restore the places long devastated; they will renew the ruined cities that have been devastated for generations. Strangers will shepherd your flocks; foreigners will work your fields and vineyards. And you will be called priests of the LORD, you will be named ministers of our God. You will feed on the wealth of nations, and in their riches you will boast.

**SECOND LESSON****1 Corinthians 12:12-21, 26, 27**

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body-- whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free-- and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.

**What is our plan for supporting the Staff Minister?**

The first part of the plan comes from blessings that the Lord has given us. This past year we were able to retire our debt. What that means is the \$2000.00 that we paid on the debt every month is now free to be used to carry out other forms of ministry rather than just paying a bill. The council plans to put this \$2000 towards the funding of the Staff Minister position.

The second part of the plan involves the Child Development Center. While first and foremost the CDC is an outreach arm of our congregation, in the past is as also at times proved to be a financial blessing as well. Over the past couple months, with the help of the State of Wisconsin, we were able to determine that our facility is able to handle more children than we have currently. With a waiting list and room to grow the Church Council decided to start small and add some more infant positions to the CDC. By taking on more infants we figure that the CDC will be able to bring in about \$3500 which would be available to help fund the Staff Minister Position. This is a good fit because one of the responsibilities of the Staff Minister would be working together with the CDC and the families that make use of the child care.

We do know that at times unexpected things come up and financial issues may present themselves, but the Church Council firmly believes that this plan will work to further the ministry of Zion.

We look forward to any input that you may have and are happy to answer any questions.

As He draws repentant sinners to himself, he also draws them into a special bond of fellowship with one another. In the WELS, we demonstrate this special fellowship bond in what is called "close communion." Thus, if you have never communed with us before, we ask that you first speak with our pastor. He will share with you the steps toward establishing communion fellowship. Thank you for respecting our practice. Personal preparation help is found on page 156 in the hymnal.
